




Location

Our campus is located in Base, a sustainably orientated building, that is part of the Manchester Science Park Community. Foundation years

For students who wish to undertake a foundation year or do not meet the standard entry requirements for admission to one of our three-year undergraduate programmes, we offer the option of an extended, four-year programme with a foundation year for all programmes.

A foundation year prepares students for the transition to university life and studying at degree level by developing skills necessary for success which include writing, data handling, public speaking, working in teams, and self reflection. During term time, students engage in 12 hours of classroom-based activities and are expected to engage in a significant amount of guided independent study outside of the classroom. Our degrees are expertly structured to combine academic, practical and employability skills.

About this course

The Computing degree offers an introduction to the core skills required by those working in the world of Information Technology and is the fundamental building block for further study and development into more specialist areas. Students will learn key skills in programming and data-base construction and management, underpinned by a thorough understanding of cyber-security, project management, and business intelligence. The role of artificial intelligence is considered as a 'golden thread' throughout the programme, as are sustainability, ethics, and professional practice. The programme also considers enterprise and the management of information technology.

This wide-ranging set of topics gives students a firm grounding in all the core areas of computing and information technology, providing them with a secure base from which to launch their career in the IT sector, or pursue further study and development.

In a world that is ever more dependent on technology, which itself is advancing rapidly in its sophistication, the Computing degree will provide students with a skill-set that his highly valued by a wide range of employers across the public, private, and not-for-profit sectors.


To submit an application to UoBM you can apply directly through our online admissions portal. We encourage all our applicants to apply as soon as they can.
